For those planning to attend community college, the site includes links to apply for the Oregon Promise program. Qualifications include: students must be a recent Oregon high school graduate or GED test graduate; attend an Oregon community college by the required start term, based on graduation date; have a minimum 2.0 GPA; and have no more than 90 college credits completed or attempted. Students may be subject to eligibility

requirements based on their Expected Family Contribution (EFC). EFC eligibility requirements are subject to change based on available funding.

If you are a high school graduate or GED test graduate between July 1, 2022, and June 30, 2023, you can apply for the Oregon Promise program this fall. For details and answers to frequently asked questions, go to oregonstudentaid.gov/oregon-promise.aspx or email oregonpromise@hecc.oregon.gov.
